Students support:

Objective:

In an academic institution, the true aim is to provide students-centred education which ensures their physical, mental, intellectual, educational, cultural, spiritual and holistic growth. It is the foremost duty of the institution to create an atmosphere conducive for learning and provide the best suited facilities and support services so that the learners become positive contributors to nation building and crave for themselves a successful career and a meaningful life. The institution strives to recognize the talents and potentials of each student and channelize their energies in the right direction by providing the requisite support services in academics, sports and co-curricular activities.

The Context:

The present age is of global competition. It is essential to bridge the gap between the students from rural and urban backgrounds, so that they can achieve the glorious heights in their professional fields. The institution aims to provide the excellent support so that they are able to develop their outstanding professional skills.

Practice:

Every student is gifted with peculiar qualities for specific fields. At the time of admission, the counselling for the choice of right course and stream is provided to the students. They were also guided about the opportunities and the scope of the course.

Skill Development:

During the academic session, many external experts and the guest faculty were invited to deliver expertise to substantiate curriculum. Many practical training programmes, workshops and industrial visits were organized by the various departments to give firsthand experience to our students. The institution provides platform to showcase and commercialize the creative works of our students through exhibitions cum sale. Cafeteria by the Nutrition department, B.D. Channel by Mass Communication department, consultancy by Cosmetology and Fashion Designing departments, stalls in the college fete by Fine Arts and Home Science departments are run by the active participation of our students.

Students Feedback and Participation:

Students' feedback is an important basis for making policies and futuristic plans. Central Association is formed every year and is involved in every activity of the college.

The institution brings out 'news magazine' to provide a platform for their creative writings. They are also given opportunity to express their views on current issues through the columns of wall – magazine.

Placement Assistance:

Placement Assistance Cell of the college organizes many awareness programmes to acquaint the students with the employment opportunities in various fields. Professionals were invited to prepare the students for the various competitive exams. Classes on Spoken English, Mental Ability and Reasoning, General Awareness and IELTS were organized under P.D.P. (Personality Development Programme). Many workshops and training programmes were arranged in collaboration with GYANAM and NIIT etc.

Transport Facility:

The college provides excellent transport facility to the students from the sub-urban areas at very reasonable rates. The college caters students from 107 surrounding villages.

Scholarships and Financial Assistance:

The college generously awards scholarships and financial assistance to needy, deserving and meritorious students in academics, sports and co-curricular activities. Majority of the students are from the financially weaker and rural backgrounds. The institution not only provides financial assistance from internal resources but also seeks help for them from external agencies, N.G.O.'s and clubs working for human development.

Students' Insurance:

Students' group insurance scheme is taken with risk cover of Rs 26,000/-.

Self Defence Training:

Self defence training is provided to students by expert coaches.

Health Programmes:

To ensure good health of students, many health awareness programmes, diet clinics and medical check up camps are organized in which reputed professionals and doctors are involved. Distribution of iron tablets is a regular feature of the college.

Evidence of Success:

Students' support activities are proved to be a great success in creating a learner friendly atmosphere. Personal rapport and interpersonal relations between the teacher and the taught are the evidence of success.

Students' Personal Counselling and Grievance Redressal:

Students' Personal Counselling Cell and Grievance Redressal Committee are established to resolve the academic and personal problems of the students. A visiting Counsellor is also engaged for the services.

Problems Encountered:

Financial constraints, and delay in grants for scholarships from government and non-government agencies are a hurdle in such support programmes.

Best Practice: II

Title: Environment Protection

Goal and Context: By the next ten years earth will become 4 degrees hotter than it is now. Himalyan Glaciers are melting are a rapid rate. Depleting water level is serious problem in Punjab. The institution realizes the graveness of environmental problems and it is practice of the college to create awareness regarding vital environmental issues and to take concrete steps to save, protect and ensure healthy environment.

Practice:

The college has a unit of Environment Protection Club which enrols 25 students every year. The students adopt plants in the campus for their maintenance. Tree plantation drive within the campus and nearby areas is a regular practice. During the session 2017-18, 80 plants were planted in Vajra Head- quarters and Govt School, Jamsher. The green audit is conducted every year. A herbal garden is maintained in the campus. The production and usage of herbal cosmetic and skin and hair care products in department of Cosmetology are also praiseworthy steps to reduce chemical products. The use of solar panel and reducing the usage of paper are also environment friendly steps taken by the college. The college has rain harvesting units and the college transport maintains the standard of pollution control. E- waste is properly managed. The usage of of polythene is prohibited in the campus. Two types of dustbins: blue and green are used to segregate the waste. A wormy composting unit is there to produce organic manure. Organic kitchen garden is also a measure in direction of healthy environment.

The sensitization of environmental issues within and outside the campus has been a major concern of the institute as forest cover in the native state has been acutely reduced. Guest lectures on 'Save Water' and 'Herbal and Medicinal Plants' were organized. The rallies, competitions, exhibitions and display of posters on environmental issues is a regular practice. Under 'Go Green Campaign', the guests are honoured with a sapling. Flex Boards with slogans' Grow More Trees', 'Save Water' , 'Save Mother Earth', 'Say No To Polythene' and 'Green and Blue Dustbins for wet and dry waste' were installed the prominent locations.

Evidence of Success: Environment Protection Club has proved to be very successful. Eye catching flora and fauna and eco friendly campus are testimony of enthusiastic approach of institution of environment protection.

Evidence of Success: Extension activities conducted in the college helped to foster the spirit of community development and social responsibility. Achievements of the N.S.S. unit and N.C.C. Cadets in camps are the evidence of their active participation and involvement in these programmes. There was a transformation in the mindset of students through health awareness campaigns. The students were also sensitized regarding *Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, Traffic Rules* and *Environment Protection*.
